From Silkworm to Sari: Sericulture in India

From Silkworm to Sari: Sericulture in India. This lecture explains the process of producing silk in India. Presenter Celeste Chalasani uses a PowerPoint presentation with photos taken on site in Southern India to first show how the silk cocoons are sorted and the various processes involved with reeling the silk to produce a silk thread suitable for weaving. She also runs a video that shows how hand weaving is still done in the village of Mangalageeri, Andhra Pradesh. She concludes the lecture with photos of saris that she owns from different regions of India.

About the Presenter

Celeste Chalasani is passionate about sharing what she knows, and approaches teaching from the understanding that different people learn in different ways. She is a graduate of the National Academy of Needlearts Teacher' Certification Program, specializing in Stumpwork. She has taught extensively both in person and virtually for the Embroiderers' Guild of America at chapter workshops, regional and national seminars; for the National Academy of Needlearts; and for other regional guilds. She also teaches an online class for Craftsy. She is a member of the National Embroidery Teachers Association.
